- **Print** these next six Station sheets, and set them up in different places in your home.
- **Colours and Shapes:** For each Station page in our journey, colour the letters, box at the top of the page, and characters. Use colours and shapes that show the feelings you have when you hear that part of the story.
- **Story Tableau:** If you have toys or creche figures that can represent the people and animals in the story, move them with you and set them up at each Station to show what's happening at that part of the story. Take a photo at each Station.
- **Music:** Each Station has special Christmas music, too! Launch the music by opening your camera app on your device and pointing it at the QR code on the lower right corner of each Station page.
- Read the "I Wonder..." questions at each Station, and talk about your ideas with your family.


And suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace to all people on earth!"
