Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant It is indeed right that we should praise you, gracious God. The universe declares your praise: beyond the stars; beneath the sea; within each cell; with every breath.

All We praise you, O God.

Celebrant Generations bless your faithfulness: through the water; by night and day; across the wilderness; out of exile; into the future.

All We bless you, O God.

Celebrant We give you thanks for your dear Son: at the heart of human life; near to those who suffer; beside the sinner; among the poor; with us now.

All We thank you, O God.

Celebrant Therefore with all who serve you on earth and in heaven, We praise your wonderful name as we say:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:

This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Celebrant We pray for the gift of your Spirit: in our gathering; within this meal; among your people; throughout the world. Blessing, praise, and thanks to you, holy God,

through Christ Jesus, by your Spirit, in your church, without end. **Amen.**
