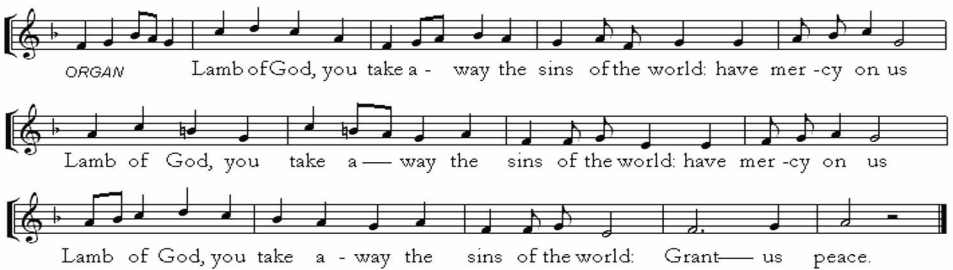

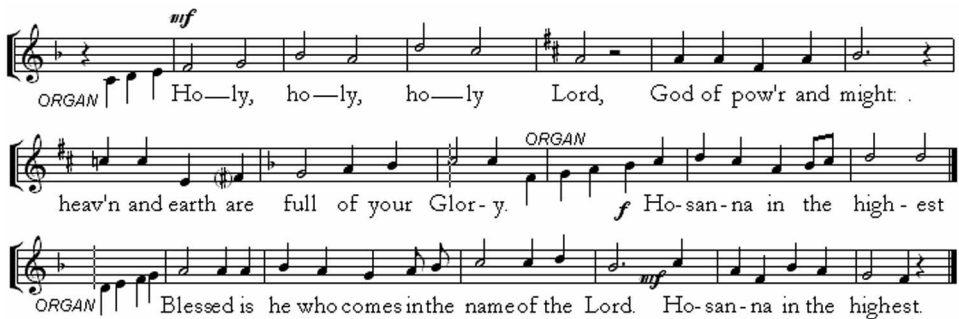

NICENE CREED

Celebrant Let us confess the faith, as we say,
